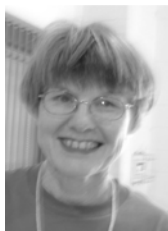

## From the Director

*Dear Parents and Singers,*



Welcome back! We're so happy that you are joining us for our 27<sup>th</sup> season! This year is shaping up to be another exciting one for the chorus. This past June, we took 29 singers to New Orleans to participate in the Crescent City Choral Festival. Everyone on the trip had a fantastic time and came back with such great stories to tell!! The concert at the famed St. Louis Cathedral was a performance to remember, and we look forward to attending this festival again in the future! On the coattails of our fantastic tour to New Orleans, we are gearing up for a trip to Denver, CO to sing with our good friend David Brunner in June, 2012! Mr. Brunner composed the song, Rainstick, that we commissioned for our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary concert in the spring of 2010.

We have created a new group: the Touring Ensemble. This group of elite singers will be our representation at home and abroad when we are invited to perform for the community at large. Touring Ensemble members have the great honor of being invited to travel with us on our annual trip as well. Their first performance will be in a collaborative community effort at the Bandshell in Baker Park on Sunday, September 11th for the 10th Anniversary Commemorative Service. Singers who have sung with the chorus for at least one year and are 10 years old by September 1st were evaluated for rehearsal participation and preparedness, attendance, vocal skills, musicianship and maturity, and invitations were mailed with the annual evaluations. Congratulations to all the singers who were selected for this elite ensemble! If you weren't selected this year, make it a goal to work towards for next year!

We have also changed the name of the Intermediate Chorus. It will be called Training Chorus II going forward. In years past, Intermediate Chorus members rehearsed with the Concert Chorus so that they could take musicianship class while Training Chorus was rehearsing. Now that everyone takes musicianship class, Intermediate Chorus rehearses with Training Chorus, and they take a higher level musicianship class. Since they all rehearse together, it seemed logical to redefine the group's name for purposes of clarity. We look forward to sharing another year of great music and tons of fun with you!

Music Pick-Up Night will be held on August 30 at the E&R Church. Each group will begin with an annual parent meeting with Mrs. DuBose upstairs in the sanctuary.

ALL parents are asked to attend! LMM materials will be distributed in rehearsals.)

Please be sure to attend on music pickup night. **Singers will be assigned music to practice before the first rehearsal.** You are expected to turn in a practice log at the first rehearsal on Sept 6th.

Parents: If you are unable to make this event due to back-to-school night, please e-mail Lee to arrange getting your singer's music. A make-up meeting will be held in the small rehearsal room behind the Social Hall on the first night of rehearsal from 7:00-7:20pm.

**Chamber Singers and Parent Volunteers:** Please notify Lee via e-mail at ([officemanager@fredcc.org](mailto:officemanager@fredcc.org)) if you can help with the setup, table manning, and breakdown in the social hall during Music Pick-Up Night. We need help starting at 5:00 and going until 9:00. If you can help for any portion, please let Lee know!

The E&R Church has requested that we **NOT** use the parking lot behind the church. Please respect their request—do not use it for dropping off, picking up, or any other reason. Parking can be found on the street and in the nearby Court Street Parking Garage. Thank you!

The forms will be due at the first rehearsal on Sept 6 (Sept 11 for Chamber Singers). Pick-up will be on Sept 20 at the Rose Hill Manor parking lot. **We will need parent volunteers to assist with setup and delivery from 4:30 until 6:00.** The mums will then be available for pickup between 6:00 and 8:00 pm.

## Concert Wardrobe

You will be sized for your uniform at Music Pick-up Night. Singers will receive their uniforms in November shortly before the concert. In November, all singers must bring in their concert shoes to be approved by Mrs. Husson. Guidelines for shoes can be found in the Info for Parents document on the website. (They must be matte black and have a very low or no heel.)

Those who have grown or may need a slight alteration due to shoes should still be able to take their uniform home at that time. You will then wear it to the concert in December. Training Chorus girls will receive their first uniform blouse as part of their tuition. Intermediate or Concert Chorus girls who have out grown their first blouse must order a new one at their own cost. Please inquire at the costume table at Music Pick-Up night if you need to do this! (We will also be holding a blouse exchange later in the fall to help eliminate the need to buy new blouses.)

All boys need to have a button down collared white oxford shirt to wear as part of their uniform. They must also have a pair of **BLACK** dress slacks, socks and shoes.

## Chorus Camp in Review

If you missed summer camp this year, you REALLY missed a good time! We all had so much fun dressing up as, and pretending to be pirates and sailors that we almost didn't notice how much work we got done! This year, the games were a special treat! Each was selected, created, or modified from past years to include the pirate theme. Campers Pinned the Parrot on the Pirate, went Fishing for Flounder, played Sharks and Minnows with the parachute (a camp favorite), played Capture the Treasure (flag), made waves during Skull Ball (formerly known as Chair Beach Basketball, another camp favorite), and teams loved playing the Shrinking Island Challenge, just to name a few. It wasn't all play though. Throughout the week campers worked diligently to learn several verses of the various sea chanteys and other sea songs selected for the concert. They were so talented that we had them singing in four parts on the first day of camp and the musical genius didn't stop there! Singers learned their music in record time. Soloists, speakers, and drummers were selected and everyone got to have a special part of some kind at the concert! Teachers were proud of campers and their work ethic. Campers worked so hard that they were able to spend extra time completing their art projects including painting their camp t-shirt, making fish and other sea creatures to decorate the gym, and painting treasure boxes, and all without losing any game time! All the art projects were used to decorate the gym to ensure the audience got a real sense of being at sea while they were with us. Both camp concerts went off without a hitch and were a big success, judging by the audience response. Campers even got a standing ovation in Walkersville! Kudos!

Teachers were so impressed with good behavior and polite manners, allowing us to get our work done quickly. We enjoyed that campers and counselors were able to play all day, no matter what we were doing. Tom will be completing his Bachelors in Music Education at Towson in 2012 and has been awarded a conducting internship with the Maryland State Boychoir (a pretty big deal!). Tom was responsible for leading the altos through their rehearsals when we separated and for preparing several songs for the concert. Tom's enthusiasm for being a pirate was pretty awesome and the campers responded by being drawn into his world of play. Leading our games this year was alumnus Robert Perrotta, affectionately called "Mr. Piranha" by the campers. Robert was in charge of setting up and running all the games, managing the counselors, and he was invited to teach the boys their song at both camps. We were very glad to have him on board! Robert was able to make every game a success and challenging campers to put their best efforts into the game. He inspired team spirit in a way that made students proud to be on their team but not so competitive that they lost sight of having fun. We hope he will be able to return next year but we also wish him luck in finding a great job after he graduates from University of Maryland next spring with a degree in Physics. I'd like to thank the teaching staff for their contributions to camp this year. We found a great formula with this team and are hoping for a repeat next year!

I would be remiss if I didn't also thank our WONDERFUL camp counselors! This year's crew was fantastic! ## Little Music Makers

We are continuing our program for 5-8 year old singers! Registration will be open through the beginning of the first class on Sept 20th. There will be a New Member Orientation on Sept 13<sup>th</sup> from 5-6pm. All singers are welcome to attend, but this day is not required. We will talk about the program, explain expectations, have a mock rehearsal and take questions from parents. All LMM rehearsals take place in the Chapel on the South side of the street. See the LMM page on our website for more information.

This form can also be found on our website. Little Music Makers tuition is \$200 per 12 week semester or \$350 for the year. Tuition includes instruction, materials and a t-shirt. Class size is limited to 25. We have created this program to extend our mission of teaching healthy singing techniques to even younger singers. Every year we receive several inquires about a program for children ages 5-8 and we are so proud to be able to provide this!



*Volunteer committee assignments will be going out in the next several weeks. Watch your e-mail for the information about your committee and your committee chair. We may have to make some changes to committees that you have requested. If we have too many people that request a specific committee, sometimes we have to shift people around to other committees that are lacking in members. We appreciate your flexibility and are happy to discuss any changes that might not work for you.*



## Rehearsal Attendance Policy

1. Be sure to arrive on time. If you are late, check in at the attendance table to see that you were marked present after the rehearsal is over.
2. Singers may miss a total of two (2) rehearsals between September 6th and the December 10th concert. Illness or family conflicts are good reasons to miss a rehearsal.
3. Remember, the only excused absences for **mandatory rehearsals on concert week** are for GRADED school choral, band, or orchestral concerts. You should notify us in writing as soon as you are aware of the conflict, but no later than 2 weeks prior to the event. If your child is enrolled in a choral, band, or orchestra program at school, and you haven't heard about a fall concert, you should call to ask. This has been our mandatory concert week policy for many, many years. Singers and parents who do not notify us prior to 2 weeks before the concert may be asked not to sing in the concert as this causes us to have to rebuild seating charts and rehearsal plans for the mandatory rehearsals. You may think that one child's attendance doesn't make a difference, but it really does!
4. We may also rehearse on days with inclement weather if there is an improvement by late afternoon. **If you are uncertain, please check our website's homepage at [www.fredcc.org](http://www.fredcc.org) after 4pm on Tuesdays and after 2pm on Sunday. We will also do our best to notify everyone via e-mail.**
5. If you have an emergency on the night of a mandatory rehearsal, please call Mrs. DuBose's cell phone immediately - 301-524-1132. If you don't call us, we may be calling you.

## Practicing and Practice Logs

Singers should be well prepared for each rehearsal and can be sure of this by working on the music scheduled each week in their practice schedule. We know there are occasions when the time expected cannot be met because of unexpected circumstances but we ask that everyone to do their best.

Parents—Please help us by monitoring your child's practice habits and signing their practice logs. Check your child's folder regularly to be sure they have turned in their logs. The practice logs can be printed out at home from our website's Forms page.

The weekly practice guidelines are as follows:

<b>Training I:</b>	<b>90 minutes</b>
<b>Training II:</b>	<b>135 minutes</b>
<b>Concert:</b>	<b>180-240 minutes</b>

Children who consistently do not turn in practice logs or who do not meet practice expectations and are unprepared for rehearsals will be put on probation and may be asked not to sing in the concert if their situation does not improve. We are serious about home practice and believe it is how we are able to achieve so much in such a short time together. Thank you for understanding!

## Concert Dates

This year's concert dates have not yet been confirmed. Our preferred dates are December 10, 2011 and May 5, 2012. We are waiting to hear from the public schools where we have submitted building requests. Once we have dates and locations confirmed with our venues we will let you know.

## Program Ads

Program ads will be accepted through Friday, November 18th for the Fall Program and Friday, April 20nd for the Spring program. The form to be submitted with ads can be found on the website. All artwork must be submitted on a disk in PDF format or properly sized on white paper and ready to scan. Ads can be turned in to the attendance desk or mailed to the chorus office. We can also accept properly formatted ads by email (officemanager@fredcc.org). To be included in the program all artwork must be accompanied by a completed Ad Form and a payment for the ad. We will also accept congratulation messages from friends and family as ads. You can turn in your ad at rehearsal or mail it to the chorus office. If you have any questions, check with Mrs. Ekanger!

## Musicianship Classes

All singers in the Chorus are required to enroll in the musicianship program in order to improve his/her sight-reading and musicianship skills. Sight Reading is a learned and practiced skill. It is valuable to singers and instrumentalists. It speeds the music learning process and enhances a singer's ability to memorize complex music. Musicianship skills are necessary to sing music written in two or more vocal part, improve accuracy, and a musicianship test is included in every All-State Chorus, college music school, and professional adult chorus audition.

Classes begin Tuesday, September 6, 2011. All classes are held in the Trinity Chapel across the street from the E&R Church. Please arrive 5-10 minutes early in order to sign-in, receive instructions, check off homework, and participate in the warm-up activity. Singers who are consistently late may have to attend additional musicianship time to make up their missed activities. Singers who do not attend musicianship regularly may be moved down a group as it is part of the contract you sign when you make your annual commitment.

The attendance policy for musicianship is the same as for chorus rehearsals. You are allowed 2 absences in the fall and 3 in the spring, for any reason. Any more absences than that will result in needing to be tested to ensure you are keeping up. Like any skill, sight-reading is best learned and practiced at regular intervals. Repetition and drills are necessary. While we expect you to practice the drills at home, we also have fun warm-up activities that reinforce your skills in a game-like setting. We give prizes for achievement in front of the group and help those who try and aren't immediately successful so they can win a prize next time. Don't be late to class or you will miss the best part! The cost of musicianship is included in tuition and covers the materials and instructors' preparation time.
